MARCH ACTIVITIES IN TIERRASANTA

Landscape Maintenance

- Treebeard continues to provide landscape maintenance services in a timely manner and within budget.
- Mulch has been added to planter beds along Clairemont Mesa Blvd., Corte Playa Catalina, and other areas.
- Infield mix (DG) was added to backstops and infields at Farb, Kumeyaay, and Vista Grande schools.
- Standard gray DG added to the track areas at Farb, Vista Grande, and Kumeyaay.
- DG was added and holes filled on the large DG play area and track at DePortola. DG also added around the new baseball diamond here.

Tree Maintenance

- A few rain showers fell again this month. No downed trees to report on City of San Diego land. Pruning and preparation for the recent rainstorms have helped.
- Tree trimming and safety pruning continues at various locations including Open Space areas.
- Tierrasanta Blvd. center medians were safety pruned from the I-15 fwy east to the end.
- Pine trees at the Farb Joint-Use Field were recently trimmed and pruned back from the fence.

Open Space Canyons

- Dishwasher Pond water has been maintained at an adequate level. Recent rains have helped to keep it full.
- Mulch has been added to several Open Space overlooks and cul-de-sacs.
- Unexploded ordnance signs are being assessed and replaced as needed.
- Friends of Tierrasanta continue their weekly cleanup removing eucalyptus tree suckers from Rueda Canyon.

- GET-IT-DONE San Diego is the official app for reporting non-emergency problems to the City of San Diego. You can report problems like potholes or graffiti and connect directly to the City's work tracking system. Walking down the street and see a problem? Take a photo and upload it from home or while still nearby. GET-IT-DONE will automatically update the problem report with information about where the photo was taken. Please download the app and participate in making your San Diego neighborhood a better place!

GET-IT-DONE is a valuable tool and helps issues get referred to the correct department.
